Lee Ann teaches SNAP-Ed programming which focuses on (1) Diet Quality including promotion of Physical Activity, (2) Food Safety, and (3) Food Resource Management. She is retiring in September 2014 and another staff person will take her position probably in January 2015. Lee Ann can offer a 3 part series, 60 minutes each, titled “Stretch Your Food Dollars”. Her goal when doing a series is to keep the same participants coming back while building on the previous lesson yet new participants can also attend.
